

Regulation of the complex doctoral examination
University of Szeged Doctoral School of Computer Science

The University level regulation of the complex examination is included in Chapter V of the Regulations Governing the Doctoral Training Programmes and the Awarding of the Doctoral Degree (hereinafter referred to as the Doctoral Regulations). The Council of the Doctoral School of Computer Science complements this with the following requirements regarding the students taking the complex examination and their supervisors.

Supervisor's assessment:

The assessment of the student described in section 5 Chapter V of the Doctoral Regulations shall be made in writing by the supervisor. In case of students individually preparing, the invited consultant or if no such exists the teacher invited by the Council of the Doctoral School shall make the assessment. The assessment shall refer to the work done by the student and shall declare whether the student is competent to write the dissertation and acquire the degree. The assessment shall be sent to the secretary of the Doctoral School at least two weeks before the date of the complex examination of the student.

Student's report:

The student shall make a one page description based on their semester reports, defining the research topic, the work done until the date of the complex examination, the publications written (submitted, accepted or published) about the research topic, and their plans for the rest of the training period. The report shall be signed by both the student and the supervisor. The report shall be sent to the secretary of the Doctoral School at least two weeks before the date of the complex examination of the student.

Student's presentation:

The student shall make a presentation of a few slides that can be demonstrated in a maximum of 10 minutes, based on which they shall hold their lecture as described in section 4 Chapter V of the Doctoral Regulations.
